## Light Therapy contest finalists announced

Phase 1: activities and installations for public spaces in Quartier des Spectacles

Montreal, June 18, 2012 - The Quartier des Spectacles Partnership is proud to announce the finalists for the 2012 edition of its Light Therapy contest, phase 1: activities and installations for public spaces. Last year, the contest yielded Nuage de givre, Éclats de verre and Forêt Forêt, which were installed in Place des Festivals, Place Émilie-Gamelin and outside the Saint-Laurent metro station, respectively. This year, Place des Festivals and the Place des Arts esplanade will be enhanced by the talents of one of the finalists, from December 6, 2012 through February 23, 2013. In all, 32 proposals were submitted.

"This year's proposals strongly reflect our desire to group complementary talents and encourage interdisciplinary cross-pollination. This year, the finalists have once again met our expectations. The winning project will undoubtedly give visitors to Quartier des Spectacles a rich experience," said Pierre Fortin, executive director of the Quartier des Spectacles partnership.

"The creative process involved in a contest gives residents the chance to rediscover places that are part of the fabric of daily life. I want to salute the talent of the Montreal artists who participated in this contest with festive, playful and participatory projects," said Helen Fotopulos, the Ville de Montréal's executive committee member responsible for culture, heritage, design and the status of women.

## PHASE 1: MULTIDISCIPLINARY COMPETITION

Creators were invited to form teams with members drawn from a range of disciplines, including urban planning and design, event production, multimedia, literature, and the performing, visual and media arts. The day/night project must offer a light-oriented experience with a winter theme and strong integration with the site's unique qualities.

The five finalists will receive \$5,000 each, conditional on completing a presentation for the jury. The winning proposal, along with all 32 submissions and the jury's report, will be made public in the fall of 2012.

## PHASE 2: NEW DEVELOPMENTS FOR LIGHT THERAPY

On june 4, the Quartier des Spectacles Partnership launched phase 2 of LIGHT THERAPY - design and production of video projection content for eight façades in the Quartier des Spectacles. This two-part contest will award the winning designer a mandate to create material that will be projected from December 6, 2012 to February 23, 2013 on the following buildings and groups of buildings: Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec (BAnQ), Centre de design (UQAM), Cégep du Vieux Montréal, Place de la Paix, Place Émilie-Gamelin, Pavillon Président-Kennedy (UQAM), the UQAM bell tower and the vicinity of the Saint-Laurent metro station. The video projections will give winter a new look by illuminating the three nodes of Quartier des Spectacles.
