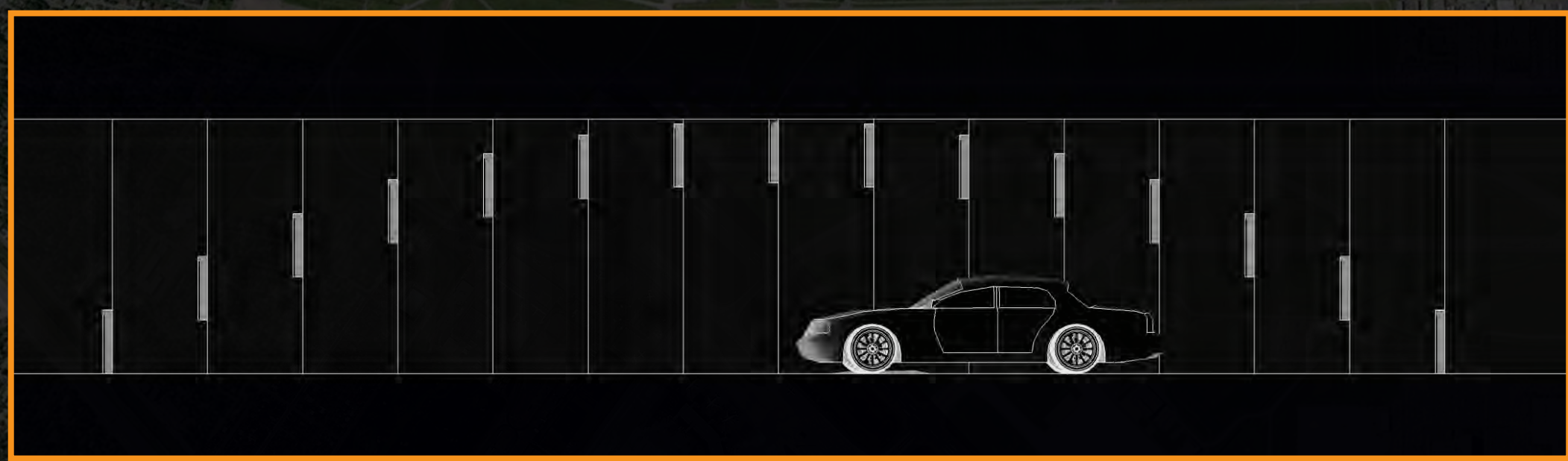


DAY & NIGHT

A day in Montreal

- 0100 • A couple exit the Dorval Interchange and turn into the Trudeau-Airport of Montreal. Their daughter is returning home for a week's holiday.
- 0400 • Vegetables and fish are loaded into trucks at the former Turcot yards to be brought to the city's markets for sale.
- 0700 • A woman heads towards the bus stop near her place in Lachine. The new street lighting makes the walk and the bus stop a lot more comforting.
- 0800 • Student cycles to school, following the cycling markers and lights towards the main track along Lachine canal.
- 0830 • Streetlights turn off. The additional lighting will turn off 15 minutes later. The roads start to get busier. Trees start photosynthesis in earnest. 2% of students are already asleep.
- 0900 • Worker alights from the AMT at Lachine station. He spots a rare green-backed heron for a second above the new forested area, before it flies out of sight.
- 1100 • Buses arrive at the Turcot yards with elementary school students and their teachers visiting the algal biofuel and aquaponics farms.
- 1230 • Man at Westminster Avenue has a trout sandwich, the fish and lettuce both grown from the Turcot yards, under an evergreen white spruce, the only one on the stretch amidst red and gold birches and maples.
- 1500 • Worker unloads another tower's algae into a tank to be picked up later to be sent for processing into biofuel.
- 1700 • An elderly man takes his weekly stroll along the new park adjacent to Saint-Jacques Escarpment.
- 1930 • The additional lights come back on. Regular streetlights will turn on in half an hour. A mother hurries home to make dinner.
- 2030 • A small crowd gathers below the Turcot Interchange. With the massive interchange and the new lighted pillars as a backdrop, a series of lighted sculptures by various artists are unveiled. They will be on display for the next year before the next exhibit takes over.
- 2200 • Having left the business district and heading towards the airport, a businessman watches as the familiar netting lights change to the wave pattern lights along the sound walls, and knows he's arriving at the airport.

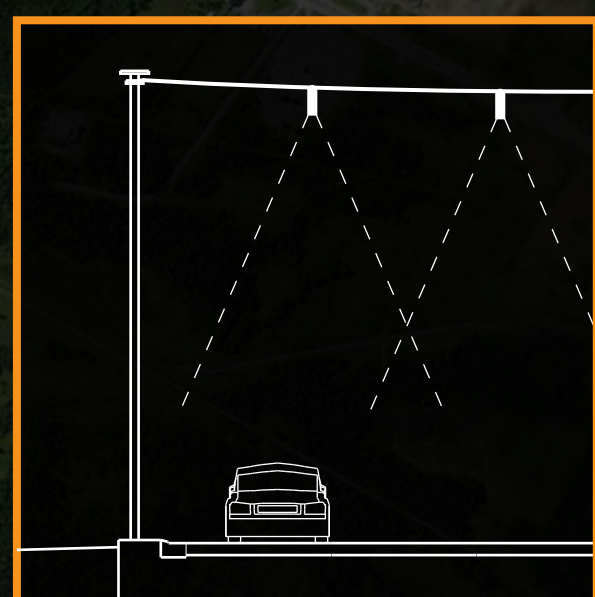
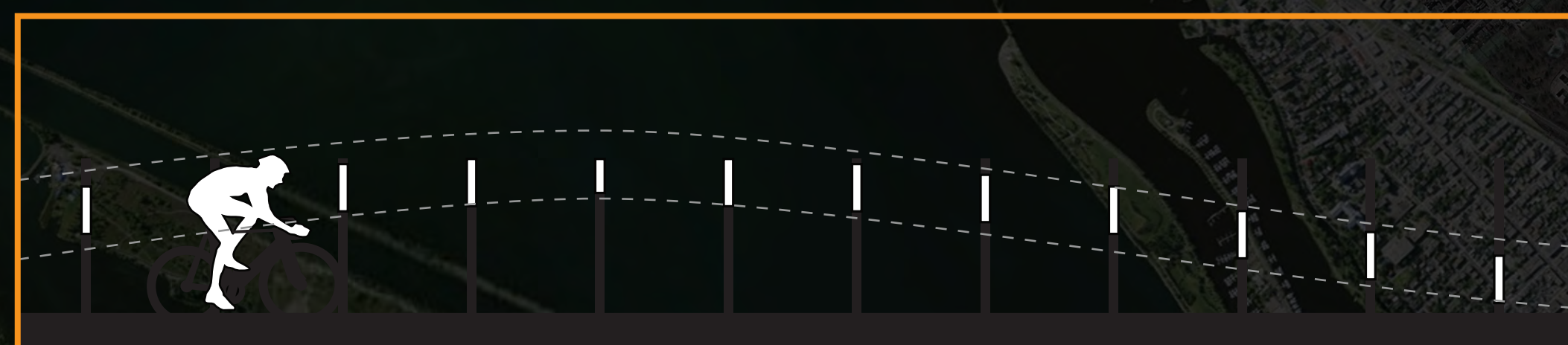
Cycling Markers
